Emma Baukhages of Gambrills started playing lacrosse in the peewee system through her community. She was home-schooled through eighth grade so her outlet for lacrosse was solely through her community teams. She switched to CC lax, a local club in her eighth grade year. When she came to Indian Creek in ninth grade, she made a significant contribution to the young team. The team effort resulted in a 9-4 record—the first winning season. Baukhages scored over seventy goals and thirty assists in that ninth grade season alone.

Over her high school career, Baukhages has been named to the second team all county, the first team all county twice, and to her club team, first team all galaxy. She has signed with the division one program at Robert Morris University outside of Pittsburgh where she will play lacrosse and be a student in the nursing program.

Brianna Guy of Catonsville started tumbling at age four. By her sixth birthday, she was better than the other tumblers at the gym so she moved to the more serious track.
