Each course is developed by a committee composed of college faculty and AP teachers, and covers the breadth of information, skills, and assignments found in the corresponding college course. The courses are adapted for the classroom by ICS teachers who consider content, learning styles and methods, and instructional opportunities. Scores on the AP exams range from 1(low) to 5 (high). Scores of three and above on a specific number of exams qualify a student for an award.
